# CHINA'S DOMESTIC POLITICS & FOREIGN POLICY IMPLICATIONS

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#### XI JINPING'S STRATEGIC VISION

- Xi's "China dream": "to build a prosperous China with a strong army under leadership of Communist Party"
- Xi's goal: to achieve China's goal of becoming a great power after its "century of humiliation" by foreign powers, recovering "lost territory" & restoring its preeminent position in the region

#### XI'S DOMESTIC STRATEGY

- Anti-corruption campaign to win public support, clean up CCP & PLA, eliminate or neutralize political opponents
- Shift from "collective leadership" to "Xi Jinping as the core of CCP leadership"
- National unity via nationalism & Xi's tightening control over CCP, PLA, media

## XI'S VULNERABLE POINTS

- Mounting economic challenges: slowdown in growth, reform of stateowned enterprises, credit expansion
- Intensified inner-CCP struggle (Jiang Zemin & Hu Jintao factions vs "princelings") for 2017 CCP Congress
- Uncertainty in PLA as anti-corruption campaign extends to top military brass

#### DRIVERS OF CHINESE POLITICS

- 3 Pillars of CCP legitimacy: economic growth, nationalism & PLA
- Economic growth: pursuit of economic security – food & energy sources
- Nationalism: defense of nat'l sovereignty, territorial integrity & "core interests"
- PLA: bulwark of national security & defense of maritime perimeter ("near seas")

#### IMPLICATIONS FOR WPS

- Island-building as part of Xi's tactic of "defending core interests" & winning support from PLA & Chinese public
- Xi as risk-taker: a balancing game of "defending core interests" vs "maintaining stability" (avoiding military conflict)
- Assertive moves will continue but stop short of full-scale war, though short, sharp skirmishes are possible

## XI ON ARBITRATION RULING

 Xi Jinping: "China will not accept any proposition or action based on the decision of the arbitral tribunal...China's territorial sovereignty & maritime interests in the South China Sea, under any circumstances, will not be affected by the award." (Xinhua, July 12/16)

## A POSSIBLE WAY FORWARD

 China's "soft line": "Pending final settlement, China is ready...to enter into provisional arrangements of a practical nature, including joint development in relevant maritime areas, in order to achieve win-win results." (PRC statement, July 12, 2016)

# CHALLENGES AHEAD

- Need for creativity, flexibility & pragmatism during bilateral talks
- Finding possible areas of functional cooperation (trade, tourism, fisheries, marine protection, antidrugs, anti-crime, infrastructure projects, Maritime Silk Road, AIIB)
- Managing disputes, easing tensions
